What is the C.A.A.R.E. Program?

C.A.A.R.E. seeks to change the paradigm of how law enforcement deals with heroin and opiate addiction. C.A.A.R.E., which stands for **Cops Assisting Addiction and Recovery**, is a law enforcement-managed program for Greenfield residents and graduates of Greenfield schools who struggle with heroin and opiate addiction. C.A.A.R.E. provides a chance at recovery without arrest by law enforcement. This groundbreaking program is designed to connect heroin /opiate addicts with treatment programs and facilities in an attempt to break the cycle of addiction for these individuals. Each person admitted to the program is paired with a Guardian Officer who will help them navigate the road to addiction recovery and serve as an advocate and resource. Guardian Officers work with providers, family members and loved ones to help build treatment plan and a support network geared toward success.

Who is eligible?

Eligibility into the C.A.A.R.E. Program is limited to Greenfield residents and those who currently attend or previously attended school in the Greenfield or Whitnall Districts. In special circumstances, admission into the program may also be granted by the Chief of Police or his Designee.



How do I get started?

Getting started is easy! Persons interested in the C.A.A.R.E. Program should contact the Greenfield Police Department and speak with Detective Sergeant Chris DeGlopper at (414)761-5345. The interested person will be asked to come in for an initial assessment to see if they qualify for the program. If accepted, they would then be given a referral to the appropriate facility.



How do I make a referral?

Referrals can be made to the C.A.A.R.E. Program by calling (414)761-5345. These referrals can be made anonymously; however, the C.A.A.R.E. Program supervisor will want to obtain specific information from the caller to determine eligibility for the program.

Can I turn in any drugs or paraphernalia?

Yes! Any individual who wishes to turn in their heroin/opiates and/or paraphernalia to the Greenfield Police Department may come into the lobby and tell the clerk they are seeking admission into the C.A.A.R.E. Program. The individual will then meet with an officer and turn in any heroin/opiates and paraphernalia to the officer without any legal ramifications from law enforcement.
